*The Golden Age of Trucking Museum is designed to accommodate visitors of all ages. Please reserve a date for your group to visit us. We are available for tour groups daily from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m.*

### *Interactive Interstate*

*Children's area with books, games, puzzles, easels, blackboard, blocks, legos, computers, videos, ride-on toys, playhouse, dolls...*

*There is also a Volvo tractor with a sleeper that adults and children can get into. It is a great photo opportunity!*

### *Memory Lane*

*A display of antique toy vehicles, and "Crosley" cars and collectibles.*

### *Media on West Main*

*A media room where "Moving History" a thirty-five minute movie is shown. It is the story of moving the Edaville Railroad from Carver, Massachusetts to Portland, Maine. Some of the antique trucks that are now in the museum were used during the move in 1993.*

### *Founder's Gallery*

*An art gallery with changing exhibits. The current exhibit is "Trucks and More...". It features the watercolors of artist Howard Shoemaker of Guilford, CT.*

### *Waramaug Way*

*An area with two antique boats, fishing memorabilia, license plates, and trucking hats, and an area where guests are invited to eat a breakfast, lunch or dinner or a light snack which you may bring or the museum may provide for an extra fee.*

### *Showroom*

*The main show room is home to over 30 antique vehicles, photographs and memorabilia. There are Dodges, Macks, GMC, Ford, International, Autocar, White, Peterbilt, Kenworth, Diamond T, Jeep, and more. The vehicles range from the early 1900's through the 1970's. Each of the displays has a written narrative to go along with it.*

### *Library Lane*

*An informal reading lounge with transportation related reading materials.*

### *Gift Shop*

*There is a gift shop with an assortment of clothing, toys, books, candles, cards, and novelty gifts and snacks.*
